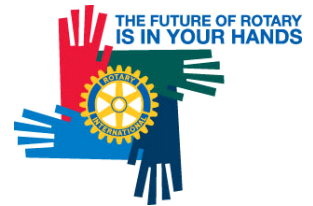

Take a moment to invite someone new to our luncheon. Both active and retired business professionals are eligible for membership. See President Don for application information and think about sponsoring them for membership.

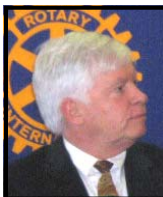

**5K Run for Polio**

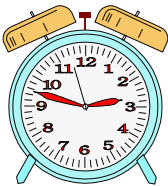

**Today - Celebrating the Birth of Papermaking**

A courtier named Ts'ai-Lun, from Lei-yang in China, was the first recorded inventor of paper circa 105 A.D. Ts'ai-Lun presented paper and a papermaking process to the Chinese Emperor and that was noted in the imperial court records. There may have been papermaking in China earlier than the above date, but inventor Ts'ai-Lun did much for the spread of papermaking technology in China. The first paper was made of bamboo, old fish nets, leaves and rags.

Today's papers are made mostly of wood pulp and fibers a vast majority of which is recycled. They are a biodegradable, renewable, sustainable product made from trees. Growing and harvesting trees provides jobs for millions of men and women, and working forests are good for the environment, providing clean air, clean water, wildlife habitat and carbon storage. When you don't need it anymore, be sure to put it in a bin designated for recycling, and it will come back to us as new paper or paperboard!

**DID YOU KNOW. . . .**

- More trees are planted each year than are harvested . The paper industry plants 1.7 million trees every single day, which is three times what they harvest.
- In 1992 there was 360% more wood in the forest than in 1920.
- 60% of paper today is recycled compared to 18% of electronic devices.
- More than twice as much wood is used for residential firewood in NY State than is used to make paper.
- Reading a newspaper everyday spends 20% less carbon-dioxide than reading an online news source for 30 minutes a day.
