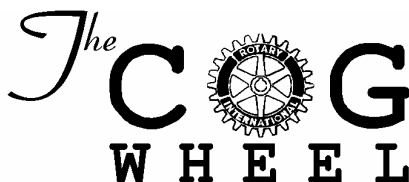

Last Week's Drawing

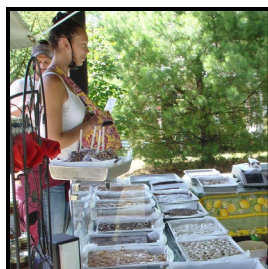

What is the difference...

Many times you go to a meeting and you hear our President talk about projects that our **Rotaract** and **Interact** Clubs are doing. Do you know the difference in these two groups? **Interact** is Rotary International's service club for young people ages 12 to 18. Interact clubs are sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which provide support and guidance, but they are self-governing and self-supporting. Our Club sponsors two Interact Clubs: Handley and James Wood. Each year we send at least two Interact students to Blacksburg for the Rotary Youth Leadership Association meeting (RYLA). These clubs are responsible for many service projects on their own and partner with us for additional service opportunities. **Rotaract** is a Rotary-sponsored service club for young men and women ages 18 to 30. Rotaract clubs are either community or university based, and they're sponsored by a local Rotary club. This makes them true "*partners in service*" and key members of the family of Rotary. We sponsor the Shenandoah University Rotaract Club. There are almost 18,000 Rotaract and Interact Clubs worldwide with more than 200,000 members, making this the single largest training ground for future Rotarians.
