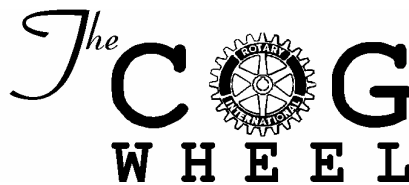

The awards are: **The Cliff Dochterman Award**, which is an award for a Rotarian particular involved in scouting, **The Four Avenues of Service Award**, **The Phil Sprengle Award** and **the Distinguished Service Award**.



Last Week's Program:

Jim Deskins from the city's Economic Development Authority was our speaker last week. Jim told us about some of the financing tools available for projects in the city and provided us a general update on the activities of his organization.

Jim started his message with thought provoking phrase, a *person becomes what they prepare to be*. Achieving your vision is doable with the EDA and community partnerships. The vision for EDA is not next year or the year after, but rather what will we be 10 or 20 years from now. Projects that he was particular proud of fostering to completion or implementation include:

- The Valley Health Expansion
- Sunshine Pride Dairy facility
- Negotiations involving the Perk Fitness building
- Solenberger Building/Shenandoah University housing initiative downtown

Jim spoke of a few other items on the agenda for this year to include O'Sullivan's facility and new equipment needs that will promote 174 new employees. The Baker Street development starting a 5-year project plan of working with one block at a time. Two new loans are available. One to offer real estate reinvestment, and one for business loans of up to \$75,000. Visit the EDA web site for more details.

Finally, with little time to spare, he asked for questions and mentioned a few popular topics: the closing of Millwood and the Taylor Hotel. And, like a well positioned politician, he ran out of time.
