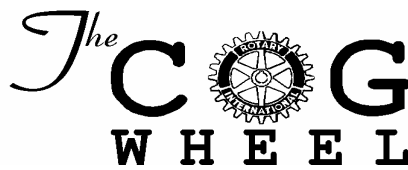

Prominent writer Philip Roth's newest book, **Nemesis**, published by Houghton Mifflin in 2010, is available almost entirely on-line simply by going on Amazon.com and clicking a few times on the book's image. The work describes in poignant detail the effects of a polio epidemic in Newark, NJ in 1946 that took dozens of lives and traumatized thousands of families. A previous epidemic in the northeastern United States in 1916 had taken 6000 lives (in Newark that year, 363). The fear and frantic response of so many people just like you and me, prior to the vaccine that prevents polio being discovered in the 1950s, just might give you as a Rotarian added incentive to work harder and give more to eliminate this terrible scourge from our planet.
