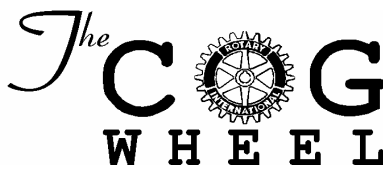

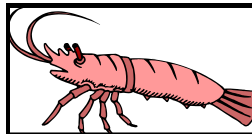

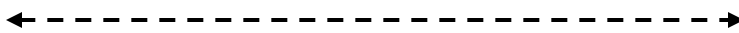
July 7 - August 4 meetings will be held from noon to 1 at our Rotary Shelter in Jim Barnett Park.
