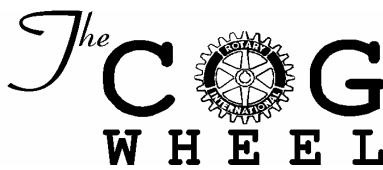

Last Week's Program

Judith James, the director of Lord Fairfax Community College's Transition Programs, introduced four new opportunities for several needy populations, including:

Middle College - a chance for 18-24 year olds who left high school without a diploma or a GED to get *both* a GED and a 2-year college degree. **The deadline for 2011 applications is July 15.**

Great Expectations - a program that allows 16-24 year olds who have been in foster care to get a college education. (According to Judith, less than 2% of children in Virginia foster care go on to get a college degree.)

Pathways Out of Poverty - gives young people ages 16-24 in the lowest income levels the chance to get a free college education and job training.

On Ramp - assists those 18 and over who lost a job since Sept. 2008 as part of the recession and gives them a chance to retrain and reenter the workforce.



New Paul Harris Awards

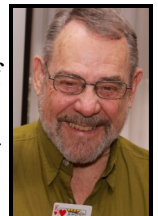
