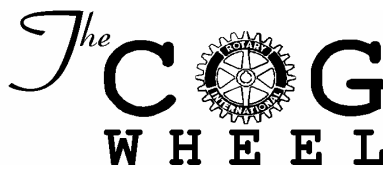

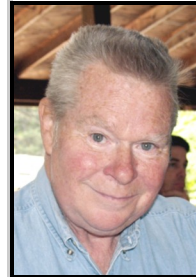


Last Week's Program

Susan Rash, the vice-president of BB&T Insurance, gave an update on healthcare reform, which she said is primarily to reduce the number of the nation's uninsured. She said that many folks are "in limbo" when it comes to making any definitive changes to their employee healthcare plans because of the perception that President Obama's healthcare bill is destined to be repealed or changed. Although several provisions in the bill are already in effect, most are slated to occur in 2014, as are the penalties for not abiding by them. For instance, states are required to set up their own healthcare exchanges by then or the federal government will step in and do it for them.

Employee coverage availability is highly subject to the size of the company with smaller companies less likely to offer coverage or, for those who do, pay for it in full. Tax credit is available for companies with less than 25 employees and individuals who have been without coverage for more than six months are eligible for a PCIP (Pre-existing Condition Insurance Plan).

Susan's advice to employers is to be patient and flexible as provisions of the plan are amended or repealed; think broadly in terms of what you can do; and try incremental change/adoption as a way to adopt changes over time.
