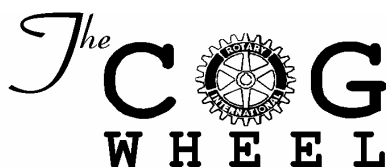

Our program will be Sarah Gomez from Winchester Little Theater talking about their Summer Camp Program, which will be supported in part this year through a combination of our club and a District Matching Grant.

Last Week's Program

Our own Dixon Whitworth enlightened us on the history of and value to our community of The Valley Health System. Valley Health serves a much larger community than just Winchester/Fredrick County as was its early mission. Currently it serves 475,000 people living in Virginia, Maryland, West Virginia and Pennsylvania. It is also our largest employer with 5,400 employees, 572 associated doctors and 144 PAs. It owns and operates traditional medical facilities such as the Surgi-Center, Emergency Department etc. but also operates the Wellness Center and Valley Home Care. It maintains 93 academic affiliations with 500 students on its campus on any given month. VHS is in our high schools promoting healthcare careers, provides support for the Free Medical Clinic and operates from multiple remote locations which act as feeder clinics and hospitals to the main hospital campus here in Winchester.

Challenges for VHS are similar to what is going on nationwide with our aging population and ever increasing cost of doing business. Healthcare Reform is a challenge as well as it is yet to be clearly defined and is rapidly becoming more expensive to implement. Even with these challenges VHS has expanded its footprint. In 2008 VHS spent \$161 million to expand the Emergency Department and adding 348,000 square feet in what is known as the North Tower. The Emergency Dept. is a level 2 facility meaning it can take care of almost any emergency save serious burns. Don't get sick or injured, but if you do VHS can help!
