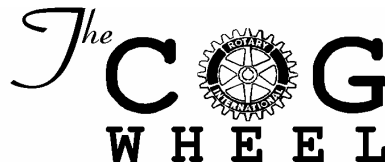

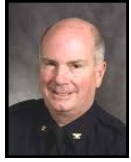
Membership Report

Our Program Last Week



Our speaker for the last meeting of August was Winchester's Police Chief Kevin Sanzenbacher. He spoke to us about the Golf Committee's beneficiary, the Frederick County/Winchester Law Enforcement Foundation. The Foundation plans to use the proceeds to purchase two needs in particular.

The first is cameras for all patrol units. Today, when an officer responds to a call that requires photography for documentation purposes, the officer has to return to the station to obtain a camera. This wastes valuable time that could be used in the service and protection of the community. The second need is trauma kits. These are the same kits that helped save victims of the shooting in Tucson, Arizona that left Congressman Gabrielle Gifford critically injured. Sanzenbacher says that these kits can be used for any event, of any scale, where immediate action on the part of the officer will save lives.

Sanzenbacher also relayed information about numerous projects that are ongoing within the department itself, as opposed to the foundation. The department is now an accredited law enforcement agency in Virginia, which is an achievement held by less than 30 agencies in the entire state. The department has also developed a collaborative partnership with agencies that can assist with overarching community goals. Also, they have a project for local court-appointed youth to receive tutoring and support services.

These are just a few of the efforts Sanzenbacher and his agency has undertaken, but the focus of all actions is to improve the quality of life for those who live in the area. Sanzenbacher also wanted to remind us that citizens are the quality control of the department. We are encouraged to contact his office anytime we have a concern, compliment, or complaint. In his eyes, the agency is truly here to serve us.

In August of 2005, Hurricane Katrina hit New Orleans. It destroyed more than 100 public schools, leaving over 400,000 students displaced in the region. Would you like to propose a New Member?

Proposing a new member is simple. Application forms are available from President Darla or Don Butler. Two Rotary sponsors are required with each application along with letters of recommendation from the two sponsors.

Be sure you talk with your prospective member before the application is filled out. Stress our “Service Above Self” motto, the things we do in our community and for Rotary International. Make sure they are aware of the attendance minimum of 65%. Tell them about the costs: \$150 to join, \$60 quarterly dues plus lunch = \$195 per quarter. If they wish to become Sustainers (helping the International Rotary Foundation) that is \$100 per year or \$25 per quarter.

Overall it takes around 40 days for an application to make its way through the Membership Committee, Classification, BOD, orientation, then be published to members. *Many thanks to those who serve on these committees. Winchester Rotary is a great club - Let’s share it!!*
