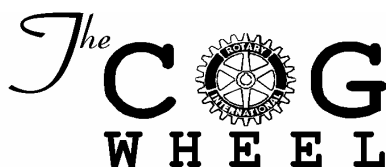

Our Program Last Week

Dr. Jesse Dingle, new principal of Handley High School spoke to us on his thoughtful and already fruitful start at the school. He began his tenure by meeting with his entire staff so that he could better know them and their needs. He surveyed not only his staff, but the students and parents to find out: 1) What they are most proud of about the school, 2) What can be done better and 3) What do they need from their principal. All three constituent groups agreed that they were most proud of the Handley tradition and pride.

Improvements desired included: bringing back honors classes, and more consistent discipline. The teachers and parents wanted more visibility (of the principal and staff) in the classroom and hallways. Updating the website and a desire for more diversity within teaching personnel were also mentioned.

In addressing these comments Dr. Dingle is enforcing the dress code in a very active manner, has eliminated extra teacher duties that were not instructional in nature, restructured faculty meetings so that they are developmental and held during the school day. They have begun targeting special needs students while simultaneously providing enrichment programs to those students that can achieve more. The website has been updated and technology is being integrated wherever possible. In addition to all of this Dr. Dingle is making a community outreach effort so that Handley will be visible and accessible to the community and businesses. What a wonderful start for our new principal who counts his being here as his greatest accomplishment.
