Last Week's Program

Our own Kevin Callanan, Executive Director, Valley Health spoke to us about the Winchester Medical Center Foundation. Surprisingly the foundation has been in existence since 2004 but its mission of making community health better visa vie the hospital is no surprise. Kevin told us of three areas where the foundation has made a big difference in community health. The first is The Hurst Hospitality House which is a facility where out of town family can stay while a loved one is in the hospital. This is a free service and is critical for those in need of this sort of help. His second example was Camp Super Kids. A camp where children with severe asthma can go and have an out of doors camp experience while learning how to manage their asthma. The camp is fully funded and simply would not exist without the Foundation. Kevin's final example was Wellspring. Wellspring is an enormous resource for those among us facing cancer. Wellspring offers expert advice and answers many of the questions that people have when facing the daunting task of dealing with cancer. They also provide wigs and clothing to those who lose their hair or body mass while undergoing treatment.



Truly the Foundation offers solace, service and the help needed for better health in our community.
