Last Week's Program

Local author Roger Engle joined us to tell us for the "rest of the story" behind his new book, *Stories from a Small Town*. Prior to beginning his writing journey, Roger was a Biology teacher for 30 years. He also stays very involved in his community serving as President of the City of Martinsburg Parks and Recreation Board. Most notably, he is a certified barbecue judge, traveling the region judging the flavors from cow and pig.

Rotary Foundation Minute

Last week's minute was once again brought to us by Conrad. In India there are more than 80,000 children that have congenital heart problems that need medical intervention, but only 8,000 to 10,000 of them are treated each year. So once again our Rotary Foundation has stepped up to assist. Rotary clubs in India and California, with the help of a \$54,000 grant from the Foundation, are sponsoring children whose families could not afford "lifesaving" operations through an initiative called Heart to Heart. This grant will help the effort reach a goal of providing surgeries for 100 children.
