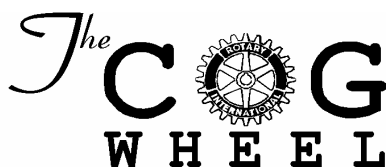

Last Week's Program—Civil Air Patrol

Captain Larry Mayer, Squadron Commander and local attorney gave us a great perspective on the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) in general, and on the Winchester Squadron in particular. The CAP was organized under the Office of Civilian Defense just 6 days before the attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941. The original mission of the group was to perform unarmed reconnaissance. However, at one point during WWII, some CAP planes were equipped with bombs and depth charges. Later the organization's role was expanded to conduct coastal border patrol, carrier and target towing, cadet youth flight training and emergency services. Today, the CAP is a benevolent organization and is recognized as the official auxiliary of the United States Air Force. Their mission is to provide assistance for search and rescue operations, disaster relief, airborne and marine reconnaissance, and youth training through their Cadet program. The Winchester squadron has 85 active members, and 55 youth cadets.



The original mission of the group was to perform unarmed reconnaissance. However, at one point during WWII, some CAP planes were equipped with bombs and depth charges.
