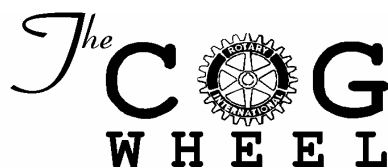

**Last Week's Program**

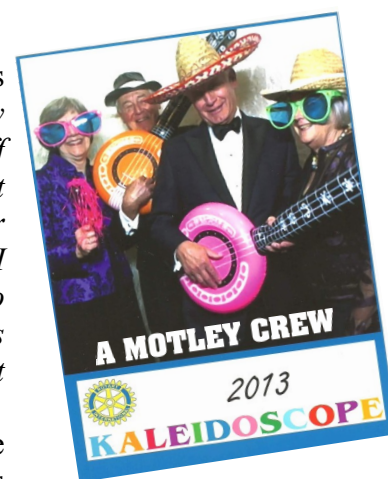
Chuck Bachman spoke to us on the ongoing project to build a memorial to area citizens who served in the Korean War. The Korean War is said to be second only to the war of 1812 for being unknown to the American public. Yet this war produced over 37k dead, 133k wounded and some 8,000 people still missing in action. The memorial will list and honor the 60 dead from the surrounding area, 12 of these soldiers never had their remains recovered. The striking design will also feature 5 pair of brass boots representing the 5 services that fought in Korea. The memorial will be located near the POW/MIA memorial and is expected to be dedicated July 20<sup>th</sup> of this year. Ground breaking ceremonies took place on a very cold March day and even with the cold weather there was standing room only. The total cost of the project is \$125,000 and they have already raised \$100,000. If you would like to donate to this worthy project, bricks can be purchased by contacting Chuck. Given the small number of people who fought in the war and are still alive, this project has moved amazingly fast.
