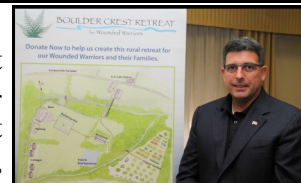


Apple Blossom Float

Last Week's Program

Ken Falke, retired Navy combat veteran, and anti & counter-terrorism expert, spoke to us about the Wounded EOD Foundation, which he started in 2004. The foundation is about to open Boulder Crest Retreat, which provides a home-like setting for wounded veterans and their families. Amputees spend six to nine weeks in bed recovering from their wounds and up to four years as outpatients. With 70% of young vets coming from rural areas, they are uncomfortable in the metropolitan Washington area, and end up stuck on the hospital grounds. Boulder Crest Retreat provides a place where they can get back to their roots. Mr. Falke expects 200 to 500 visitors per year, spending 2 to 14 nights each. As our military presence in Afghanistan ends, Boulder Crest will move from an out-patient focus, to include care-givers, and helping Gold Star wives and mothers. Eventually, Boulder Crest will become a Hope and Wellness center for veterans and all members of their families. For more information, go to their website; www.bouldercrestretreat.org.
