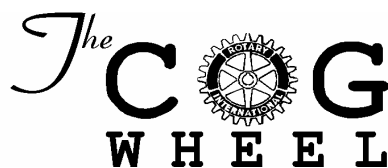

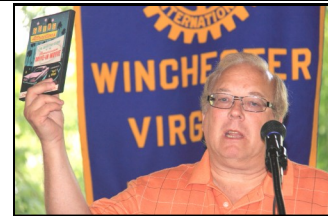


Welcome New Members

Last Week's Program

We welcomed Jim Kopp, owner of the Family Drive-In Theater in Stephens City. Jim started by telling us of his life-long obsession for drive-ins. Did you know that drive-ins got their start because of a devoted son whose mother was too large to sit in a typical theater seat. So in 1933 he put her in his car, strapped a projector on the roof of the car, hung sheets on the fence wall, and gave his mom the opportunity to watch a movie in the comfort of the front seat of his car. The idea of watching movies from a car caught on and was extremely popular in the mid-1900s. Today however, there are only 9 remaining drive-ins in Virginia.



Jim started in the business by purchasing the Raleigh Road Drive-In in North Carolina off E-bay. The drive-in needed everything done to it to bring it back to life, so Jim was able to gain valuable experience at all levels of drive-in theater operations. In 2009 he was asked by the Dalke family (original owners of the Family Drive-In) if he would like to purchase their facility as they were retiring from the business. Jim always wanted to come back to the area and the answer was an easy yes. Since then he has made some positive changes to the drive-in including a ramp system for improved visibility. He will soon convert to digital which will improve both the picture and sound quality. He has plans to expand to a third screen and update the bathrooms and concessions. He is most proud of the international publicity his drive-in receives because it is a dying past-time. In addition he was honored to be asked to prepare the questions/answers for the July 4th edition of the Jeopardy show category "At the Drive-In".

The Family Drive-In is open from mid-March to October. It is a nostalgic family experience with classic speakers and the "traditional" concession stand. AND you can even bring the dog.

Foundation Minute

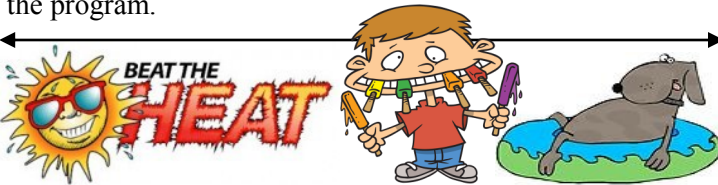
