


Our Last Program

Our own Marc Jaccard presented a very touching slice of life at the Evans Home. Opened in 1950, the Evans Home has been making lives better for kids with no other place to go. While recent state decisions on group home options for kids have changed the nature of referrals to the home, there is still a huge need for its services. What makes the home work is that the kids help each other. Evidence of its success is the Lloyd Alumni House which was opened 10 years ago. It's an extension of the Evans Home specifically for alumni, and its never empty. With added capacity, the Evans Home has begun taking in some homeless children referred by local schools and social services.



There are just so many success stories, it's hard to comprehend what our community would do without the Evans Home, and what a blessing it has been for us.

Foundation Minute

Last week we discussed one of the six focuses of The Foundation: Peace and conflict prevention/resolution. The foundation enables Rotarians to promote the practice of peace and conflict prevention/resolution by:

1. Training leaders, including potential youth leaders, to prevent and mediate conflict
2. Supporting peace-building in communities and regions affected by conflict
3. Supporting studies for career-minded professionals related to peace and conflict prevention/resolution

This is a two year "masters" program, with up to 110 new students per year, with schools established in Argentina, Australia, England, France, Japan, South Africa and two in the US (Berkeley and UNC).
