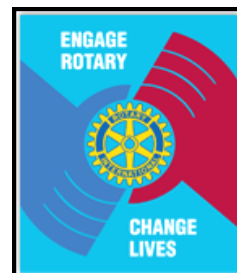

Last Week

Julie Ferrell of Big Brothers Big Sisters shared information about her non-profit and how it differs from the Boys & Girls Clubs. (In a nutshell, BBBS's doesn't have a primary facility to which youth go—their volunteers perform their service wherever the kids are.) Volunteers must be at least 18 years old (21 if they're going to transport kids) and there is no upper age limit—in fact, Julie says "empty nesters" make up the second-largest group of volunteers, right after 18-24 year-olds.



BBBS volunteers provide mentoring opportunities and a role model for young people who live in broken homes or have lost a parent and need positive reinforcement in their lives. Julie told the heartwarming story of "Rick and Nick," who bonded over their BBBS relationship and, as a result, Rick stayed in school and is making his life count for something.

BBBS is housed on the Youth Development Center and has recently been meeting with other YDC organizations to discuss a joint fundraiser.
