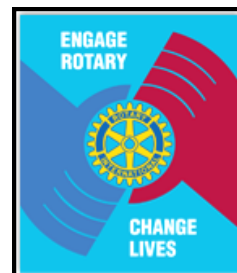
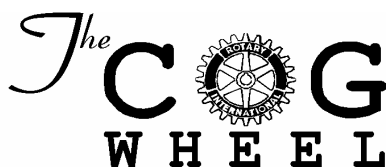

### Last Week

Park Ranger Eric Campbell gave all in attendance a fascinating presentation about Cedar Creek and Belle Grove National Historical Park. The location's preserved acreage was once the site of a decisive 1864 Union victory that essentially ended Confederate military resistance in the Valley. (It was also a victory that is thought to have significantly contributed to President Lincoln's reelection.)



The park was created by Congressional authority in 2002. It was the nation's 387<sup>th</sup> designated park. At the time, a Congressional report determined that not only was the battle of Cedar Creek of significant historical importance, but the site of the battle was seriously threatened by encroaching development. As a result, its preservation became of immediate importance.

It's important to remember that the park, which is also the site of the beautiful Belle Grove Plantation Manor House, is also charged with representing the unique cultural history of the Valley. In addition to the walking tours, visitors can tour the house and learn about the grounds at the new National Park Service Contact Station. Additionally, next year is the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the battle, and because of the unique manner by which the park is chartered, it is the only national park where reenactments are allowed on the grounds themselves, so look for updates on programming soon.
