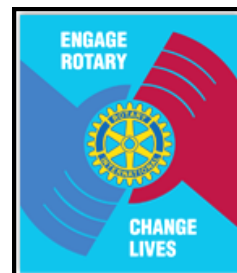

### Last Week

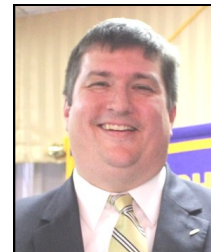
Dave Sovine, the 2013 United Way Campaign Chair, addressed us last week. He relayed numerous details about the impact the organization has on our community through its three areas of focus.

The first area of focus is education. It is critical that students are reading on grade level by second or third grade. The United Way supports literacy and education programs, as well as efforts to improve access to early learning opportunities.

The second area of focus is income. Many local residents (including large numbers of families with children) are living in poverty, and they could directly benefit from programs that increase the household's earning potential.

The third and final area of focus is health. The United Way recognizes that preventative care saves lives (and money in the long run), but many families do not have the means to obtain care. Its efforts support programs that assist local residents with their healthcare needs.

To advance opportunities in these three areas, the United Way has set a campaign goal of \$1,150,000 for this year. Dave was happy to share that they currently have more than \$475,000 towards their goal!
