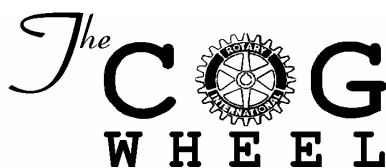
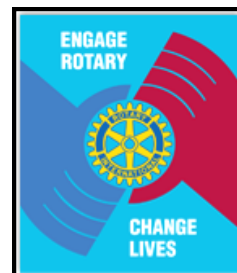

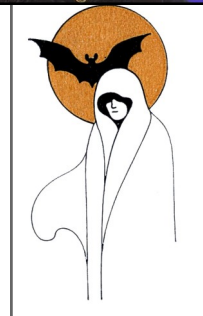

Last Meeting

Sandy Jones, a local expert on all things that go bump in the night around Winchester, was the speaker for our last meeting in October. She is the woman who can be found clad all in black leading the wildly popular Ghost Tours of Winchester. These tours attract 80 to 100 people who come to learn about some of our spookiest residents.

Sandy started her presentation with an explanation. Winchester is a place that has seen its share of conflict, and as a result, "a lot of people have been left behind." Most of the well-known landmarks downtown are home to restless spirits. Judge Handley walks the rotunda of the Handley Library. The former Miller's drugstore (now V2) is home to a sorrowful lady who seeks a child that died before birth and was burned in the cellar. Soldiers who had been taken prisoner can be seen on the lawn in front of the Old Courthouse, and a couple of cheerful poker players smoke cigars and wave at the living from an upper floor of the Godfrey Miller Fellowship Home.

Perhaps the most interesting ghost story is that of the Cork Street Tavern. The building was original built to be a church, but it has never been used for that purpose. Instead, it has primarily been a tavern. However, there was one brief period when it was a "house of ill repute." To this day, tavern workers can hear a women's voice calling after John, the tavern's builder. Candles are relit after being blown out, and supplies fly off the shelves. *Believe it...or not.*
