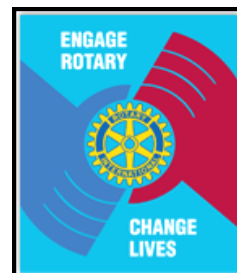

Gene Schultz

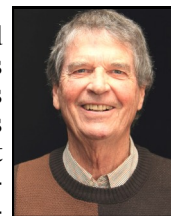
Gene grew up in Winchester and admires his father who drove a truck for 30 years without an accident. After graduating from Handley High School and enrolling at William and Mary College, during orientation he met a field hockey player and a swimmer. The former later became his wife, Karen, and the latter became their bridesmaid. After graduating from college, Gene joined the staff of the Virginia Planning Commission. Thanks to years of cross-country running, Gene not only distinguished himself with multiple awards and rankings, but he also gained the patience and endurance to work for the State of Virginia. Before retiring from the Employment Commission, Gene helped to place individuals in over 30,000 jobs. In retirement Gene enjoys biographies and histories written before 1913; he pursues photography, biking and kayaking.



Having served 3 terms on the Rotary Board and over half the chairmanships of the Apple Blossom Arts and Crafts Festival, Gene is also a multiple Paul Harris Fellow. He sponsored the first female Rotarian in her entry to the club and achieved perfect attendance by accident. Why does he stay active in Rotary? Consider the Foreman Reading Garden, Kaleidoscope, Coats for Kids, Salvation Army bell-ringing, the Boy Scout shelter, Camp Fantastic, The International Wine event, Health Care Jamaica and Haiti – and all the social service, civility and diversity that is Rotary.

Tom Baker

Tom was born and raised in Winchester and attended Virginia Tech. For 46 years, he has been a member of Rotary where he served as president in 1972. He remembers Rotary picnics and meeting in the GW Hotel. Tom declares that Rotary is an important part of life. What is Rotary about? It is friendships, fellowships, international and vocational ethics, and leadership in community. And what is more, is the diversity of service. Active members of Rotary help to eliminate polio worldwide; they help dig wells; in Pakistan, they accomplished the delivery of tents within days of the massive earthquake. Through all this, Tom finds that Rotary gives back more than any Rotarian can give. Tom loves helping community, getting involved as a volunteer, and service above self. "Your talent is god's gift to you; what you do with your talent is your gift to god."
