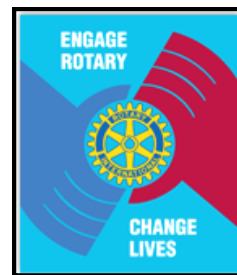

We still need door prizes, silent auction items, and other such goodies for the District Conference. If you have something to donate, please let President Don know.

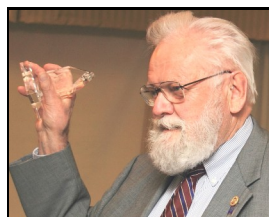
### Hands Against Hunger

We were treated to new member talks from Sue Scarborough, and Tom Byrd.

Sue defines herself through several different roles; wife, educator, administrator, volunteer, and lifelong learner. She has been married 16 years, and enjoys time at home with her husband. She works on crafts, and he is a do-it-yourselfer. They also enjoy travel, tennis and old movies.



Originally from Pittsburgh, PA, Sue's career in education began when she was a kid and set up a classroom in her basement and even wrote the books! She earned a BA in Elementary education from Clarion University, and a Masters reading specialist degree from University of Pittsburgh. Starting as a teacher at Thurston Winchester School in Pittsburgh, she later became a director.
