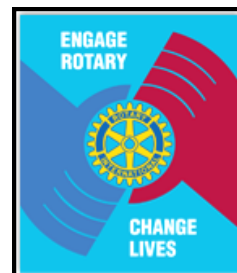
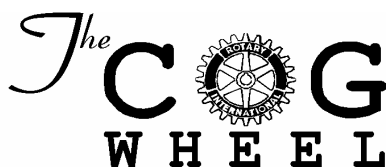

Our Program Last Week

Mike Guvermont: Representative of and consultant to **Teen Inc.** spoke to us about the youth program. Mike became involved in Teen Inc. as a result of the work



and experiences he had with the Juvenile Detention Center. He was a charter employee at the center so when he heard about Teen Inc. it touched him. He saw how Teen Inc. offered hope to troubled & disabled youth which is a key and missing ingredient missing for many kids out there today.

Teen Inc. reaches out to and serves at risk youth and youth with disabilities. Many of the youth come from Grafton School and also thru the Juvenile Detention Center. The goal is to teach skills to these kids that allow them to attain and retain meaningful employment. Many have been successful in the program because of it's hands on approach and community outreach component. Resume' writing, application and interview skills are taught as well. The teens community service component includes a food program where they work in a garden/greenhouse, learn about growing foods and donating to the area food banks. They also sell some of the produce to help with the program. Amazingly they grow 600 head of lettuce/week during the growing season. The results of Teen Inc. efforts are impressive indeed as 54% of their post program kids do not become repeat offenders.

Mike encourages us to tour the Teens garden, facility and work areas, it is very up lifting.
