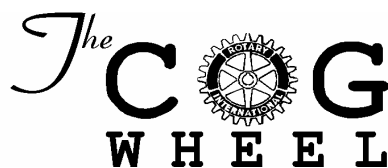

**Last Week's Program**

Felicia Hart and Ken Rice spoke to us about the **Community Foundation of the Northern Shenandoah Valley**, which manages 70 funds valued at over \$1 Million.



Community foundations by nature have geographically-defined territories and the CFNSV covers Clarke, Frederick, and Warren Counties. Unlike traditional non-profits, which usually spend donor funds on immediate needs, a community foundation invests funds to make a lasting impact "for the long haul," according to Felicia. There are several types of funds, including;

**Agency Directed** - funds set up by a local non-profit to further their own mission.

**Donor-Advised** - funding that is invested in general areas of the donor's interest. While not directed to a specific agency, the donor can indicate general interests, such as youth or sports.

**Donor-Designated** - funds invested for a specific charity as advised by the donor, such as Chain of Checks.

**Scholarships** - education-related funding.

**Unrestricted** - funds given to the foundation for use at its own discretion. (Like all non-profits, they love those...)

The CFNSV offers additional services to its clients, including public relations/promotions, grant management, and the loan of wireless credit card machines.



Ken Rice took the opportunity to present Community Fund donations to the Fremont Street Nursery and Timber Ridge School.



President Don ended Felicia's presentation with a real bang by presenting her with a check for \$100,000 to establish a donor-designated fund in our club's name. Think of what a 50/50 jackpot that would've been...
