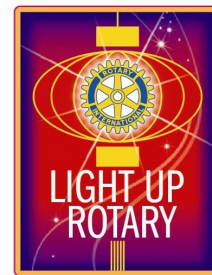
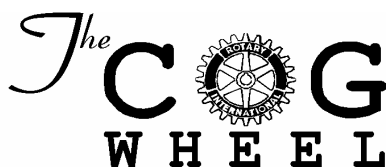

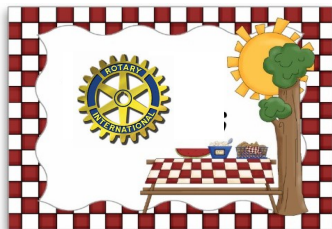

and four members of the **Eastern Panhandle Scorchers softball team** joined us for lunch and talked to us about their team, their sport and their goals.



The Scorchers are a non-profit Under 18 Junior Olympic fast-pitch softball club for young women throughout the Tri-state area of Virginia, West Virginia and Maryland. The Scorchers are comprised of 13 girls with six coming from Winchester, Warren and Clarke Counties. The girls show incredible commitment to their sport practicing three days a week throughout the year. From June to November the Scorchers travel within a two hour radius of their hometowns to compete in showcase tournaments with hopes of attracting the attention of college scouts. As is the case with recruiting for all college sports these showcase events are the modern day bridge connecting college coaches with high school athletes. The girls show great dedication to their craft sacrificing their weekends and summers with the hopes of funding their path through college and continuing to compete in the sport they love.

The Scorchers are finishing up their first year and it is Sibert and Colerick's goal to expand the number of tournaments the team enters including future trips to Virginia Beach and Jacksonville, Florida.
