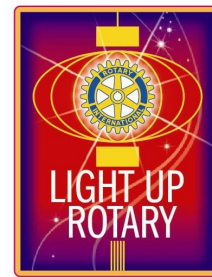

### Our Last Program

Troy Henson, Executive Director of **Stop Hunger Now** spoke to us about the organization and how we Rotarians could help. Stop Hunger Now is an international meals program that operates by leveraging organizations like ours to raise money and provide labor to fill meal pouches.

The organization expects to serve 50 million meals next year, 3/4 of which will have been made possible by Rotarians. The meals cost about \$ .35 a piece to make and while not tasty in the traditional sense, it is a complete and highly nutritious meal that can revive a child's body so that they can maintain health. Stop Hunger Now distributes almost all of its meals overseas, but has on occasion provided emergency meals to U.S. disasters. In most cases though, Americans won't eat the concoction.

Meals are aimed at schools where it serves the dual purpose of food and bait to get the kids to school. 20% of the meals are sent to areas of the world suffering disasters of man or nature. For example, meals are being sent now to areas where Ebola is ravaging people's ability to work or get food. In many cases a meal from Stop Hunger Now is the difference between life and death.

Troy expressed his passion for a world without hunger. He feels that this goal is as achievable as our current goal of stamping out Polio. With this in mind he challenges us to at least match the 1 million meals that North Carolina Rotarians raised money towards and packed last year.
