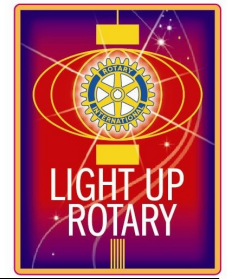
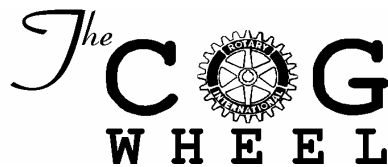

Last Week

Four representatives from the Winchester Little Theatre (our 2015 Kaleidoscope beneficiary) shared their appreciation and their hopes for the WLT’s future:



Board President Henry Tignor shared the WLT’s history, beginning with its founding in 1919 and its first production in 1920, its brief “intermission” during World War II, its conversion to a community theater in the 1950’s, and its long-running success even today.



Volunteer development director Dolly Vashon thanked us for our last Kaleidoscope donation in 2007 and pledged to make great use of this year’s funding to restore the WLT roof to its former greatness. (She also guaranteed a fun time to anyone attending the upcoming weekend’s event.



Architect Tim Machado went over the specifics of the roof restoration project, commenting that it’s a wonder the roof hadn’t collapsed yet. It was built—like most buildings a century ago, with the expectation that heat from inside the building would rise to the roof and melt the snow, preventing too much weight from building up. Modern insulation, however, prevents that and leads to roof collapses in older buildings.



David Logan of Vintage, Inc., explained why the building structure has held up after all these years. (Credit lime mortar, which holds up much longer than Portland cement, as it allows water in and out.)
