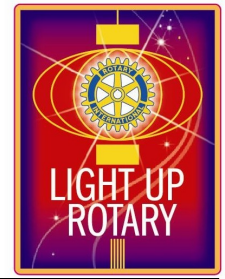
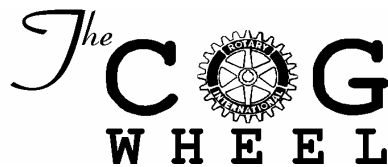

Our Program Last Week

Kelly Bober the director of the Child Safe Center on North Cameron Street in Winchester spoke to the club about the organization and the realities of child abuse. The Child Safe Center's mission is to promote a child focused approach to the investigation, prosecution and treatment of child abuse by providing a safe, child-friendly facility, a Multidisciplinary Team response to abuse allegations and professional support, education and advocacy services. Winchester's Child Safe Center is one of 16 in the state of Virginia (the next closest is in Leesburg) and 700 in the United States. The Child Safe Center allows a victim of child abuse to be interviewed in a child friendly room by one interviewer trained to gather evidence in a way that is legally defensible and developmentally appropriate for the child. The interview is a coordinated effort between professional agencies to minimize the child's exposure to reliving traumatic events. The final component involves therapy for the child at no expense to the victim. The Center serves roughly 250 children each year ranging from 3-18 years old.



Kelly is the only full-time paid employee at the center and is dependent on volunteers, donations and grants. Kelly is recognized by the Supreme Court of Virginia as an expert on child abuse and forensic interviewing techniques. She began her career 20 years ago in Norfolk and estimates that she has touched thousands of children's lives in Winchester and Hampton Roads.

The Center will be hosting a Superhero 5K and Kids Run on April 25th at Greenwood Mill Elementary School.
