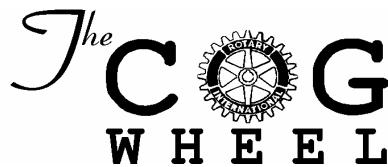
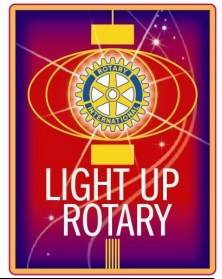

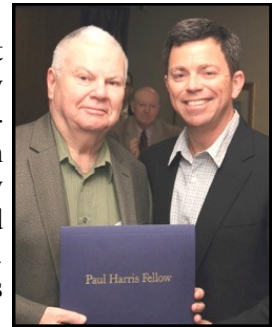
**Libba's Health Report:**
