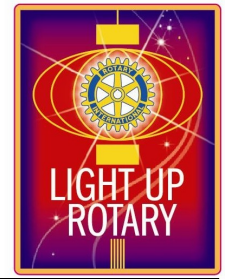
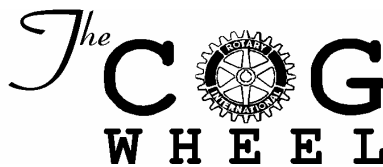

NEW & IMPROVED APPLE HARVEST FESTIVAL

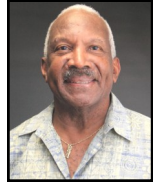
Save the dates: SEPT 19 AND 20! YOUR participation makes this event possible. Festival planning is in full swing with lots of fun activities for the whole family.

Chuck Peterson is seeking sponsors for multiple musicians, bands & live entertainment scheduled for both days.

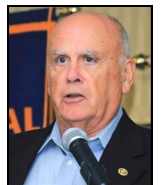
Our Last Program

Guss Morrison was born in Knoxville, TN in 1935. Although he was the 5th child, he was followed by the birth of 7 sisters leaving his family 75% female. In 1957, he graduated from public school but was unable to enroll at the University of TN as it was not integrated at the time. His degree in Political Science was awarded by TN State University. Just days after his honeymoon, on 23 June 1962 Guss received a draft notice and served in the Finance Office in Germany. Upon his return to the U.S., he regained his employment at the Veterans Benefits Office. In 1968, the Dept of Labor selected him to work in their Employment Security Administration Office. Later he migrated to Employment and Training, became Chief of Research and Training, and eventually Director of Policy and Planning with the Obama administration.



Guss now is retired and enjoys skiing and ski instruction in Colorado. He joined the Rotary Club of Winchester nearly one year ago in September of 2014. **Welcome Guss!**

Upon his birth, **Bill Old** moved outside his comfort zone in November of 1938. Raised in New Jersey, but with roots in Winchester (via his grandfather), Bill eventually moved to Virginia in 1955. Upon graduating from the VA Military Institute, Bill was sent on active duty to Korea. Upon his return to the States, he became a teacher at the Potomac School in McLean. By 1968, his teaching career placed him as headmaster of the Hill School in Middleburg, VA. Years later, the only integrated school in the region of Jackson, TN, hired Bill to head the Episcopal Day School.



Compelled to leave his comfort zone once again, in 1980 Bill removed his children from school to spend a year sailing through the Bahamas. When he returned to the U.S., he became headmaster at Powhatan School until 1985. A new career then took the form of financial planner for a succession of firms.

Bill has been married since 1966, sky dived with his wife and has two accomplished sons. He enjoys choir music, and was a member of Rotary Club in Tennessee as well as in Stephens City. **Welcome Bill!**

Libba's Health Tip

Eyes may be windows to the soul, but they also indicate potential health conditions. Eye exams are recommended on a regular basis. Noteworthy anomalies such as the following *may indicate* certain conditions:



- > Dark circles under the eyes may be related to allergies
- > Yellow bumps may show a high cholesterol level
- > Brown spots may indicate cancer
- > Loss of eyebrows at the outer edge may be caused by a thyroid imbalance
- > Inability to close one eye can accompany Bell's Palsy
- > Retinal amyloid plaque may be a sign of Alzheimer's Disease
