

Our Last Program

Gary Robinson and Doug McCloy thanked the Brills for their warm hospitality and for their love of Jamaica. Children in Jamaica have limited opportunities, which is exac-



erbated by poor eyesight. At times, fuller progress at school is impaired by vision problems that all too often have gone undetected. Fifty percent of the 120 Jamaican school children screened need eye glasses (compared to 25% in the U.S.) Recognizing this important need, Robinson and McCloy have initiated the "See Better, Learn Better" campaign.

After building a computer lab, the mission center collaborators have summoned the resources to erect a comprehensive facility that includes a full eye clinic, dentistry, education and training areas. With the current ability to screen a child's vision every 10 seconds via **Plus Optics**, more individuals are being served. The eye surgical unit now removes cataracts and in a two-week time, treated 170 patients. Notably those who were blind now have vision.

Western Jamaica is host to the sugar cane fields. The preponderance of cane sugar makes dental interventions also very necessary. The Brills and other volunteers are offering their expertise here.

Our Rotary District is responding to a global grant to fund equipment and vocational training that will promote sustainability in-country. As the lead club in this endeavor, **The Rotary Club of Winchester** has committed \$15,000 (which will be funded in part by the Apple Harvest Festival).
