### OUR PROGRAM LAST WEEK

**Kevin Walker** CEO of the Shenandoah Valley Battlefields Foundation brought us up to date on their activities and goals. Kevin served as both a Director and Ranger for the National Park Service at Antietam National Battle Field prior to joining the SVBF. Kevin has appeared in many educational films on the Civil War and is a published author focusing mostly on Antietam. He recognized and thanked Trish Stiles and State Senator Jill Vogel for the invaluable help they have given the Foundation. Kevin also expressed his fondness of Rotary because his father was a Rotarian and at the annual Rotary Christmas parties his uncle played the role of Santa Claus and Kevin never suspected the ruse.



The Shenandoah Valley Battlefields association is the designated caretaker of our battlefields in the Shenandoah Valley. It was formed in 1996 by the Congress and is the first of its kind charged with Battlefield preservation efforts and is modeled after the United States National Parks. The Foundation is also meant to be an economic driver for the Valley. Winchester has been a focus because of the many activities that occurred here during the civil war. In fact three major campaigns and five major battles took place in Frederick County during the Civil War. Amazingly there was some sort of fight every 3-4 days in the Winchester/Frederick County area for 4 years. The Battlefield Foundation was established to protect those hallowed grounds and increase economic activities associated with visiting the various sites. When considering the economic benefits it is notable that of the 5 states that maintain the most battlefield sites they bring in over 16 million visitors annually. Millions of dollars have been invested locally to save the sites and even more money in creating supporting businesses. In the last 15 years 4,084 acres have been conserved and 784 acres have been put in park like settings. Most recently the Third Battle of Winchester was bought, conserved and is actively being put in the condition it was during the war. There are now signs explaining the battle, walkways have been created and it has become a regularly visited site by locals and distant visitors alike.

Just this past January the Foundation agreed to partner with The Old Court House Civil War Museum along with Harry and Trish Ridgeway to maintain the Ridgeway collection and run the museum. This will not only preserve the Ridgeway collection but also pave the way for rotating collections and make the museum a bigger focus for visitors here in the Valley and Winchester in particular. Kevin noted that the historic district is more than just about the fight between the Blue and Gray but also a valuable lesson about the divisions between people and the dangers that brings. Teaching about our Civil War is a great example of why we need to come together as people and not fight. Battlefields help underscore that. Saving our treasured assets is an important part and not doing so means those assets and lessons are lost forever.
