OUR PROGRAM LAST WEEK

Committee chair **Tom Rockwood** presented a program on the history and operations of the Student Loan and Scholarship Committee.

The committee originated due to a bequest in the will of Henry Courtney, of Baltimore, in 1936. Mr. Courtney was the uncle of Dowell J. Howard, a member

of The Rotary Club of Winchester and a District Governor. Mr. Courtney's bequest was in honor of Mr. Howard with a value of \$20,000.

The funds were initially distributed to our club annually by Rotary International in Chicago but in 1944 the funds were transferred to our club thus giving our Loan and Scholarship Committee local control and administrative responsibilities.

The fund is now 72 years old and has a total value of \$610,000 (\$390,000 in the scholarship fund and \$220,000 in the loan fund).

The current distribution policy was adopted by the committee in 2013 and states that loans outstanding will not exceed 50% value of the loan fund or \$100,000, whichever is less. Scholarship awards in each year will not exceed 5% of the prior year end balance in the scholarship fund. Maximum annual loan or scholarship awards are currently set at \$3,000. We currently have 22 outstanding loans and 13 scholarships. 3.25% interest on outstanding loans does not accrue as long as the student remains in good standing and shows satisfactory progress toward a degree.

Since April 2013 the funds have been managed by VNB Wealth Management with Stephanie Fincham acting as the contact person. Tom acknowledged Stephanie's contributions and importance to the committee.

Applicants are referred to the committee from the guidance offices at the local High Schools, by Rotary Club members or apply directly from The Rotary Club website. Tom singled out club member Earl Riddick for referring two "outstanding" candidates in the past year.

Two members of the committee interview each prospective candidate and report their recommendation to the full committee for approval.

The committee is always looking to expand the funds impact. Currently they fund a \$3,000 annual scholarship at LFCC to a student enrolled from Winchester or Frederick County. This amounts to a full tuition grant.

In addition to Mr. Rockwood the committee members are; Patty Taylor, Marc Jaccard, Adrian O'Connor, Mary Riley, Cary Claytor, Sue Scarborough and Winston Lutz.



Libba's Health Tip dealt with hearing. We all suffer from some hearing loss as we age but we can limit that loss if we are careful. When you are in regular contact with loud sounds use hearing protection. Without hearing protection it is recommended that you don't spend any more than 8 hours at a time around a lawnmower (90 decibels) or 30 minutes

at a rock concert (120 decibels). If you notice hearing loss don't hesitate to see a doctor. If left untreated the hearing loss could lead to other health issues.
