

Gene Schultz, a longtime member of our club, spoke about the 100th Birthday initiative that our club is undertaking for the next five years. It will culminate in 2021 when are club turns 100 years old and the goal is to have our club members log 100,000 volunteer hours for local charities.



The effort will be divided into 6 categories:

- Environment and Preservation**
- Health and Human Services**

Gene also gave a short history of our club, noting that the first attempt to form a Rotary club in Winchester actually occurred in 1919. - The Community Foundation**




