LAST MEETING

Janet Callis, from the **Highland Food Pantry** spoke to us about how her organization serves the needs of our community. Highland Food Pantry began 20 years ago as a ministry of Highland Memorial Presbyterian Church, in Winchester. It is a 501(c) 3 organization whose mission is to feed people in the northern Shenandoah Valley experiencing chronic hunger.



Highland Food Pantry serves 587 households, totaling 2029 people. They also deliver food to senior citizens who are unable to get themselves to the pantry.

Janet shared the story of a family in which the husband was unable to work due to an injury. The family of four, including two children, lost their home and had to live in a motel. They were required to check out every morning and live on the street, then check back in to the hotel in the evening after the mother received enough daily pay to fund another night in the hotel. The opportunity to receive a nourishing meal once a week has a major positive impact on families like this.

The food distributed through the Highland Food Pantry comes from those who have too much of it, and goes to those who have too little. The suppliers include local supermarkets such as Fresh Market.

There are three important items that the Highland Food Pantry is in need of. They need a refrigerated cooler with sliding double doors, for storage of perishable foods including milk and eggs. They need a freezer chest for storage of frozen foods. And, they need a computer so that they can convert to modern record keeping and inventory processes, which will allow volunteers to spend more time helping their clients.

Janet invited Rotarians to visit when they are serving on Tuesdays between 9-11:30AM, and 6:30-8PM.
