Director Cathleen Henderson gave us an overview of what's happening with the **Winchester-Frederick-Clarke Habitat for Humanity Restore**. The Restore has recently relocated to 400 Battaile Drive in the old WestCo. building which dramatically grew their retail space.



The Restore sells excess or gently used building supplies, appliance, fixtures and other building products. Most prices for the items range from **50% to 90% below retail**. Their recent move has vastly increased the retail area which allows for easy identification and display of products for sale and offers a pleasant shopping experience. They've tried to mirror the large home improvement stores by better grouping of items. All bathroom items together, all kitchen items together, flooring etc. With the extra floor space, all shelves are lower and within easy reach.....also improving the customer shopping experience.

All profits from the Restore are used to further their mission of mobilizing our volunteer community to help hardworking, low income families break the cycle of poverty through affordable homeownership. **Habitat is celebrating their 20th year in Winchester** and in those 20 years they have rehabbed and built dozens of homes for people who deserve a helping hand. So before you buy any building materials, give the Restore a look, you could find just what you need and save a lot of money.
