### OUR PROGRAM LAST WEEK...

**City Sheriff Les Taylor** spoke to our club about what the City Sheriff does and how it has improved. The City Sheriff is a Virginia Constitutional office and Les has served as sheriff for the past 4 years. Les began his career in law enforcement in 1996 and he has steadily moved thru the ranks.



He has authored a children's book which promotes positive attitudes about law enforcement within the community and teaches about why bullying is wrong. He is currently working on a second book for children. Les and several of his deputies read regularly to young children in an effort to put law enforcement in a positive light. He also works with Literacy Volunteers for the same reason.

The city sheriff's function is to serve warrants, provide security for the court, perform levies, evictions and prison transport. They also have law enforcement functions including serving emergency commitment orders for mental breakdowns etc. The City Sheriff's office currently consists of 13 full time deputies, 13 part time deputies & 4 administrative employees. Funding for our sheriff's office comes primarily from the city itself but the state also provides reimbursement of around \$337k. The total budget this year is \$1.2 million.

Les has provided training for the deputies and himself and upgraded staff resources so that they are now accredited by the state. This accreditation not only makes for a more professional department but also makes the department eligible for federal funding. The department recently received money from an anonymous donor for the purchase of and care for an explosive detection k-9.

Les is very committed to raising the quality of the Sheriff's office through education and crisis intervention training. Les believes that crisis intervention is the key to effective law enforcement.
