Their volunteer activities encompassed a total of 138 events. Obviously too many to list here, but a few highlights were their participation in the United Way Day of Caring, staffing the Kid Zone at our Apple Harvest Arts & Crafts Festival, Coats for Kids, participation in RYLA, and working with “the famous Don Butler” to ring the Salvation Army bell.

The **James Wood High School Interact Club** was similarly active, under the faculty guidance of Sharon Sweet, and club President



Emma Stasiak. Their long list of volunteer activities included selecting and wrapping gifts for children at the Evans Home, making blankets

for patients to use during treatment at Shenandoah Oncology, making Power Packs for Bright Futures for use by students who need food and clothing, measuring rice portions for Stop Hunger Now, and collecting money for Coats for Kids at Arby’s.

The Interact clubs at both high schools are quite an impressive and energetic group of young people. They set a great example for us to live up to!

RULE OF 85 CHANGES

The new RI policy put in place as of July 1, 2016 by the Council on Legislation stated you must have 20 years of Service in Rotary plus your age in order to request the R85 classification.

At the Board meeting last Thursday, March 23, our Board approved a motion to grandfather all members of the Club as of June 30, 2016 under the old Rule of 85 classification. This means if your age plus years in Rotary total 85, then you can apply for this membership classification, and it lowers your dues structure to \$62 per quarter and when you attend the Club Thursday meetings, you pay for your meal.

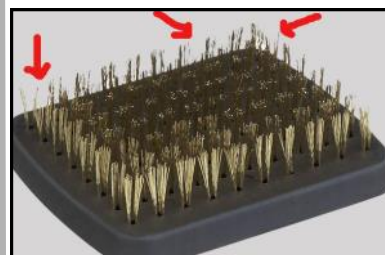
Pat Kofalt won \$24 in our last drawing but missed the Ace of Spades....so today's jackpot will start at \$337.
