OUR LAST PROGRAM

Mark Sweberg, PhD spoke to us on his Biblical Architecture specifically as it relates to his work on the ancient city of Sodom. Sodom was long thought to have been known but thru Biblical study it is now believed to be located in Jordon along with 4 other "Tells" that contain the remnants of the daughter cities of Sodom. The ancient cities are located in what is known as a "Tell" which consist of multiple period cities that had been rebuilt over top one another over a long period of time. Sodom is located some 600 feet below sea level and deep into the earth. The site was identified from Biblical descriptions which tell the story of Abraham and Lot having a family falling out. The Bible tells us Lot agreed to relocate his family at a known distance from the original family site. In the year 2000 archeologists followed these Biblical directions to the suspected Sodom Tell. However it was only after 8 years of digging and research did archeologists feel ready to declare the site as Sodom. Virtually all but three scholars agree now that this is the site of Sodom.

Interestingly Sodom did burn from fire and brimstone just as the Bible stated. The geological record tells us that in the late Bronze Age during the period of the Minoans there was there was a comet that exploded one mile above the earth and above the Mediterranean Sea. This explosion was so hot that it caused the sand at Sodom and surrounding area to turn into glass and the vacuum created by the explosion caused 12 trillion gallons of salt water to drench the soil. The salt water sterilized the land of Sodom for over 700 years. The Biblical account had God destroying the city because of its inhabitants had lived such immoral lives. Research (no judgement here) tells us that the city did have a widespread practice of homosexuality and likely negative judgement from the surrounding cities. 700 years later and after the land had recovered a city was built and inhabited on top of ancient Sodom.
