OUR LAST PROGRAM

Shayla Fitzsimmons graduated from Powhatan School in June. At Powhatan, she was elected to be the school's Post Captain and won the drama, sportsmanship and service awards.

An avid athlete, Shayla runs and plays lacrosse and soccer. She now plays travel soccer for two teams in Loudoun, and was selected to the Virginia ODP soccer team last year.

Shayla just started her freshman year at John Handley High School where she plans to run cross country, play soccer and be involved in service, drama and forensics.

Shayla loves travel, music, dancing and helping others. At 14 years old, she is headed back to Haiti for the 4th time later this fall where she leads an initiative to offer soccer camps as a vehicle to empower Haitian girls. This initiative is in partnership with The Community Coalition for Haiti. In 2007, over one hundred girls attended Shayla's Project Haiti Soccer Camp, where young girls focused on empowerment, gratitude and positive attitudes towards education and family. Haiti, being the poorest country in the western hemisphere offers limited opportunity for young girls to receive an education and also to participate in sports. Shayla's camps are geared towards breaking down the barriers that exist and offering girls the opportunity to achieve and dream towards a brighter future.

Health Tip

Libba told us our pets need heat & sun protection too.

- Don't leave your pet in the car**
It only takes 15 minutes for an animal to get heat stroke and die in a hot car!
- Exercise early in the morning or late in the evening**
It's best to avoid walking, running or hitting the trails with your buddy on hot days or warm, humid nights.
- Prevent heatstroke**
Exposure to high temperatures, humidity and poor ventilation are often associated with heatstroke.
- Protect your animals from sunburn**
Check with your vet for pet-safe sunscreen, or keep at-risk pets indoors when the sun is high.
- Avoid hot pavement**
Can you believe that when the air temperature outside is 77 degrees, asphalt in the sun has been measured at 125 degrees?
- Never leave a dog unattended with access to a swimming pool**
Teach your dog how to swim safely to the steps and get out, or fence in your pool.
