Darla and Paul explained the agonizing decision to cancel this year's event due to the severe weather forecast. OUR LAST PROGRAM

Executive Director of the MSV (club member) **Dana Hand Evans** and *MSV Director of Community Engagement* **Laura Wiley** updated the club on the Museum's expansion and specifically its new trail system. The concept of the museum trails system was developed to create a public art park on 90 acres of the MSV's 210 acre campus in the middle of Winchester. The three mile trail system will allow the community to enjoy nature and art installations 365 days a year. Dana said the system will be a series of paved, grass and rustic trails and they will be ADA compliant. Some of the highlights of the project include a new entrance to the museum off of Wood Avenue, a new event lawn in front of the museum and a floating boardwalk system through the wetlands off of Amherst Street. The trails will be open from dusk to dawn and MSV staff will be on site to handle maintenance of the trails. The total project cost is \$7.2 million. Dana said they have only \$750,000 left to raise. Three pieces of art for the trails are already sponsored but Dana and Laura expressed that there are many more sponsorship opportunities available. The MSV did not receive any funding from the city for the project but partnered with the city to write a grant to VDOT. Dana said the target date for completion of the project is fall of 2019.
