Our Program Last Week

Michael Williams spoke about his recent trip to Ghana to perform Rotary service. He led off with the comment that Ghana is "not for tourists," unless you are partial to raw sewage, painfully long car rides along pothole-filled dirt

roads, and no amenities whatsoever. However, if you are service-minded and looking for a place that needs help of any kind, then you will be very happy there.

Michael has been working with Rotarian Walter Hughes of the Rotary Club of Rocky Gap (google him!) to dig wells and provide assistance to the town of Adadease. They are currently building an elementary school using all local volunteer labor and Rotary-donated supplies. Michael's dream is to build a junior high school there and he is actively fundraising for the project in order to qualify for a Rotary District Grant. The price tag is approximately \$40,000 for materials. Labor will again be provided free of charge.

One of the things Michael observed about the communities he visited in Ghana is that people get along with each other, mostly because they have to. They have no electronic distractions or easy means of escape, so they learn to work things out. He also admired the way older youth and parents look out for younger children and try to provide them with things they themselves didn't have growing up.

Ghana is receiving more International attention for the human trafficking that occurs there. Desperate parents sell their children to fishing boats for the equivalent of \$250 per child. That leads to a life of hardship and potential drowning since most of the work has to be done in the water and 75% of children in Ghana cannot swim.
