Our Last Program

Our own **John Lamanna**, Executive Director of Timber Ridge School spoke to us on Timber Ridge School and their mission. Timber Ridge was established in 1971 to respond to the need of having a 24 hour facility to treat and deal with boys ages 10 to 18 who have behavioral issues or who have had substance abuse issues.

John joined the staff 43 years ago and has seen the program change over the years but what has stayed the same is these are not bad people but rather people who have had bad experiences. Timber Ridge operates as both a middle and high school which allows for credit transfers once the student has returned back home to their permanent school.

The student to teacher ratio is an impressive 7:1 and the school has been recognized as a school of excellence. There are currently 45 students living on campus and more who are helped with a home based program. The school understands that the best way to keep kids moving forward in life is for them to have employable skills. This is why they are planning a new Career and Technical Training Center.

Personal accountability is a number one priority and starts with each and every child making their own beds every single day. A values based life is what sustains all of us and this is the goal for Timber Ridge students. The Board of Directors at Timber Ridge is comprised of many of our club members and certainly John has devoted his professional life to helping kids succeed in life via Timber Ridge.

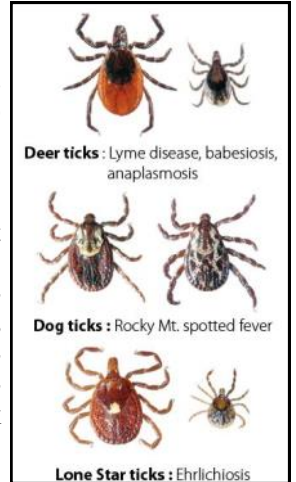

HEALTH TIP;**AVOID THE CRITTERS!**

With the warmer weather deer ticks become more prevalent and thus so does the risk of Lyme Disease. Lyme disease is not easily identified as the symptoms are many and diverse. The red bulls eye that we think of is not always there or seen and the fever, chills, aches and pains may be misunderstood for what they are. Treatments are known and achievable via antibiotics but the earlier the diagnosis the faster an infective can be cured. So check yourself for ticks often and if you have any doubts about having Lyme disease, see your doctor.
