Our Last Program

Irv Shendow delivered an "experienced", "veteran", "older" member talk. Although club members are struggling to come to a consensus on the name for these talks we all agree this is a great new tradition, to hear from a member at the end of the Rotary year who has been a part of the club for a long time.



Irv gazed the room at the start of his talk and commented that he, "sees so many faces who have done so much for our wonderful community."

Irv was born in Winchester and attended Handley from grades 4-12. He attended the University of Virginia on an athletic scholarship playing offensive/defensive tackle for the football team. He spoke about the thrill of competing against Army when they were the nation's top team. Having developed a love of flying at age 17 he studied aeronautical engineering at UVA. He commented that 1959 was a banner year for him as he married his lovely wife Sarah and joined his family's retail clothing business, Bell's, that same year.

In the 1960's Irv flew for the Air National Guard based out of Martinsburg, WV. He said how fortunate he felt to be getting paid to do what he loved. By 1969 Irv felt that it was becoming too much to fly for the Guard, help run the family business and raise his family so he gave up the Guard and returned to Winchester full-time. In 1971 Irv joined the Old Town Development Board and at his first meeting was named Chairman. Under Irv's leadership the board helped create a special tax district which was instrumental in converting the Loudoun Street Mall into a full pedestrian mall, positively changing the Winchester business community forever.

In 1973 Tom Baker brought Irv to our club. Irv said at the time the Club was raising roughly \$15,000 a year to distribute to causes within our community. Irv joined forces with others in the Club to think bigger, work harder and raise better. Irv spoke with great pride at the results of Kaleidoscope, an idea that he and Dick Wiltshire brought into existence. Irv noted that in its 18 years Kaleidoscope has raised over \$1 million dollars. Irv said that the single greatest change in his 46 years as a club member was in 1987 when women first joined the club. He called it the club's "salvation". Irv concluded his talk by stating how proud he is to serve with a high quality group who is willing to work and to give back to our community.

HEALTH TIP

As the summer solstice approached Libba described the benefits and dangers of sun exposure. The sun supplies us with Vitamin D which promotes bone health, brain functions, and sleep quality. It lessens the symptoms from Alzheimer's Disease and eases the symptoms of depression. Libba also stated that studies show children whom are frequently exposed to the sun will grow taller later in life. Of course sun exposure is the leading cause of skin cancer so it is recommended that you only get direct sun exposure early in the day for only 10-15 minutes before you **Slip/Slap/Slop/Wrap**. **Slip** on long sleeves, **Slap** on a sun hat, **Slop** on (at least 30 spf) sun screen and **Wrap** on those sunglasses for ultimate protection.
