Our Program Last Week

President Cary spoke about her origins in Rotary and how she learned to be of service from a very early age. Her father, Bob Claytor, has been a member of the Woodstock Rotary Club for more than forty years and took Cary to meetings when she was a young girl.



In college, her sorority was very active With Boys & Girls Clubs and she worked for the Peace Corps in West Africa following graduation. It was there she saw the devastation of polio up-close and she has been a firm believer in Rotary's polio eradication efforts ever since.

Her first job Stateside was as an accountant in Richmond. Since Rotary had yet to invite women as members, she joined the Junior League in Richmond. Upon moving back to Winchester in 2002, she was invited to join the Winchester Rotary Club and was immediately put to work on Kaleidoscope.

Cary shared the current RI motto, "*Rotary Connects the World*" and encouraged our members to seek those connections by saying yes when asked to serve. Did you know there are 35,000 Rotary clubs throughout the world and 1.2 million Rotarians? Our club is by far the largest in District 7570 with 180 members. Our budget for the coming year is \$131,000.

Cary has three goals for the coming year:

- 1) Obtaining a District Grant (which we have already received word we are receiving) it will go toward the Winchester Adult Day Care Center to provide nutrition services;
- 2) Membership retention and recruitment, which should benefit from the Membership Committee's recent adoption of two new classifications of membership, corporate and associate;
- 3) Achieve Gold Club Status and a President's Citation for excellence.

We have no doubt she will be successful in all three and with her well in her engagement to be married in November. (She's role-modeling how to say yes.)

NEW ROTARY MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES:

Corporate Membership

To attract and retain a qualified and diverse professional base within the community. One corporate member joins and pays full dues, including meal costs. In this structure, others from the organization can attend the meetings, join in service projects and serve on committees. Only the designated person with the RI number can be eligible for executive leadership. If other employees attend at the same time as the designated person, each additional person is charged for the meal. This structure works best with one other employee, but up to three employees may be designated to attend. Whereas a Corporate Membership will have the same attendance requirement as a Regular Membership, any employee's attendance at a Rotary meeting shall count for the corporate member's attendance record. Corporate Members will be tracked separately for awards purposes and have a separate category for annual attendance.

Associate Membership

Associate Memberships will be available to those interested in joining The Rotary Club of Winchester who are age 35 or younger. The \$150 initiation fee would be waived, and the young professional would also receive a 20% discount on their quarterly dues. The Rotary Club of Winchester will recognize an Associate Member for two years. The club will have no more than 5% of their membership listed as Associate Members.
