Our Last Program

Dave Darsch, entrepreneur in residence at Shenandoah University and Jim Martin, district director of SCORE Virginia, spoke to the club about entrepreneurship and their efforts to mentor entrepreneurs of all ages. (SCORE = Service Corps Of Retired Executives)

A handful of club members raised their hands when Jim asked, "are you an entrepreneur" and he rebutted by saying that we are all entrepreneurs because Rotarians are "agents of change." That is the message he uses in his work with SCORE-Virginia. SCORE is a national organization that was founded in the 1960's with a mission of combining entrepreneurship with volunteerism and it was initially funded by Congress through the Small Business Association. Jim described the various programs SCORE offers for youth, women and a newly created program for veterans. Jim encouraged us to visit <u>score.org</u> and explore opportunities as a subject matter expert, workshop coordinator or mentor.

Dave described his role at SU as helping to bridge Shenandoah with the community. Dave has enjoyed his time at the Byrd Business School and likes being around "passionate individuals who can convert I can't into I can". Dave said that he has a goal of building an entrepreneur's incubator here in Winchester. Dave said every entrepreneur should ask "why can't you?", "why wouldn't you".
