Our Last Program

The club was treated to 2 new member talks at our last meeting.



Kevin McKannan passed through Winchester on his way to a concert in North Carolina while in college and immediately identified it as an area of interest. He was sold a few years later when he attended his first Apple Blossom Festival with his college roommate. Kevin graduated from Lockhaven University and relocated to our area. He worked in sales and was instrumental in establishing the Wellness center in

Martinsburg. After working in real estate development and being exposed to legal work Kevin decided to get his law degree. He went into business for himself and worked in collections for a short time. Military service always interested Kevin so at age 39 he joked his "mid-life crisis" involved him joining the Army National Guard. A few years ago he was deployed to the Middle East where he was a member of the JAG corp. Kevin served overseas for ten months. Now back stateside he is currently in his last year of his contract with the Guard. Kevin has two children one is a junior at George Mason and the other a senior at Handley. Kevin commented that during all of his varied life experiences he has learned to always surround himself with the right people and he declared that in his view there is no better person than his wife.



Kim Blosser was named President of Lord Fairfax Community College in 2018 but her speech focused on her family's long history living in the Blue Ridge Mountains. Kim's family goes back four generations living in Page County and she currently has two sons at Page County High School. Kim's great-great grandfather was a cattle farmer on the mountain and her great-great grandmother's funeral

procession was the first ever on the newly formed Skyline Drive. Her ancestors were expert hunters and anglers but were forced to move off the mountain when the Shenandoah National Park was created in the early 1900's. Kim said her parents met while working on Skyline Drive and just recently celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. She says how important that beautiful stretch of road is to her family because of their long history there. Kim shared the story that her father and all of the boys in their small town of Stanley, VA created what was known as the Stanley Sandlot Baseball Group. They kept meticulous records of their results and statistics. The Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY became aware of these records and this past July there was induction ceremony with Hall of Fame librarian Jim Gates. The Sandlot group is now apart of the historical record for our nation's pastime. Kim closed her speech by stating that her Rotary participation carries extra significance for her because her father was afflicted with polio at a young age.
