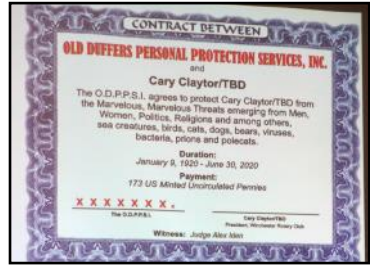
Our Last Program
