Our Last Program

Our program was presented by **Rotarian Wayne Murphy** from Charlottesville, who spoke about the **Rotary Action Group for Peace Program**. Wayne is a New York native who has been in Charlottesville since 1980. He is a 29 year Rotarian who has served as Assistant District Governor. He is currently the District 7610 Peacebuilder Chair. Later Wayne spoke at our board meeting outlining how our club can help this exciting new initiative.



Rotary's New Generations Peacemakers Program is designed to encourage the study of conflict resolution and peace building. Wayne's district is the third Peacebuilding District, as they donate to the six Rotary Peace centers where persons pursue degrees in conflict resolution. Wayne noted that there are currently 1,200 Rotary Peace Fellows worldwide. Some 100 people graduate from the program annually.

His presentation included a video produced by Rotary International which showed how a focus on Rotary's 6 areas of service can contribute to peacemaking. Trends show that we are now living in most peaceful period in human history, and there is a new global peace system emerging that recognizes that the economies of peace are stronger than the economies of war. All are hopeful signs for a more peaceful future. Wayne concluded by challenging our members to visit the **Rotary Action Group for Peace** website, which is a great resource to learn more about the Rotary Peace project, and see great suggestions for Peace Building projects.
